This Guide is designed for students in the last two years of high school. Individual and small groups are encouraged, with the students generating their own knowledge. It

contains two books: Coral and Coral Reefs, and Mangroves.

(1) Coral and Coral Reefs includes the following topics: origins and types of coral reefs, corals - the reef builders, plants and animals on coral reefs, how coral reef organisms interact, caring for the reef, and safety on the reef.

(2) Mangroves: Ecology of Intertidal Forests discusses the mangrove ecosystems, mangroves - the primary producers, primary consumers of mangroves, microscopic animals of the mangrove forest, invertebrate macrofauna and fish fauna in mangroves, and the terrestrial animals of mangrove systems.

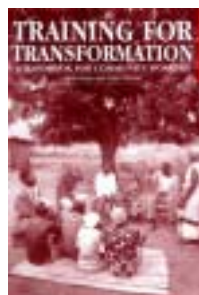
